Why The Name “Night Eyes” ?

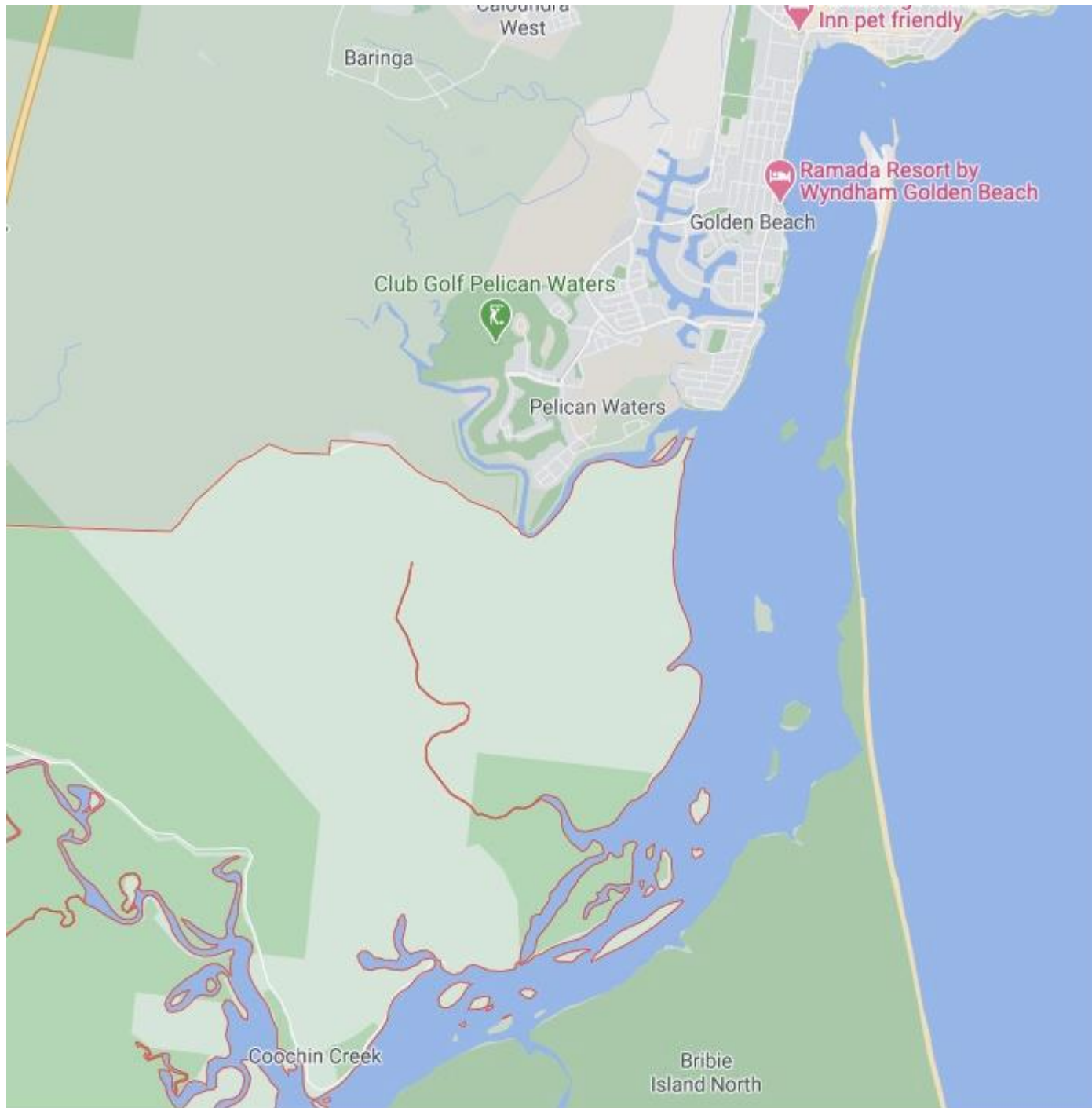
Night Eyes was formed 20 years ago to keep a watchful eye over happenings in the Pumicestone Passage and surrounding areas.
